

St. Joseph's Institution Established in 1957. St. Joseph's school has grown into a group of institutions over the past 54 years rendering its services to thousands of students and its neighborhood. At Present, there are 7 institutions:

- 1. St. Joseph's Pre-Primary School (LKG in 2008 UKG & Nursery in 2009).
- 2. St. Joseph's Hr. Primary School (Kannada Medium Aided in 1957; Unaided English Medium 6th and 7th Std, in 2006 & 2007 respectively.)
- 3. St. Joseph's High School. (Kannada and English Medium in 1961)
- 4. St. Joseph's Composite P U College (in 2004)
- 5. St. Joseph's Boarding House (in 1958, Closed around 1968, restarted exclusively for low-income pupils of Hassan and Chikmagalur districts in 1988.)
- 6. SJFGC in 2009.
- 7. St. Joseph's College hostel (in 2011)

This report covers the period from August 2010 to September 2011.

The Degree College, affliated to Mysore University, started in July 2009, has two courses- B.Com and BBM. Though we have permission from the University to start the BCA course, it did not really take off owing to paucity of applications. The Demand for B.Com is on the increase. We have resisted the temptation to start one more section to B.Com.



ANNUAL REPORT : 2018-2019 ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

The educational system at St Joseph's College, Hassan, includes a pattern of training that will imbibe the basic values of tolerance, humanity, consistency and pursuit towards excellence in every student. Since its inception, the institution has shown growth and progress in academics, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

ANNUAL REPORT: 2019 - 2020

ANNUAL REPORT : 2021 - 2022

Introduction:

The College has a proactive 'Youth Red Cross' unit.
















MUSIC; A THERAPY

NEED FOR SPEED

Formula One was first defined in 1946 by the Commission Sportive International (CSI) of the FIA, forerunner of FISA, as the premier SingleSeater racing category in worldwide motorsport to become effective in 1947.

A Formula One car is a single-seat, open-cockpit, open-wheel formula racing car with substantial front and rear wings, and an engine positioned behind the driver, intended to be used in competition at Formula One racing events.

Sticking an actual price tag on a current F1 car is difficult. An F1 team may spend \$145.6 million (just adjusted for higher transportation costs plus inflation) in the 2022 season.

And the Top speed: 300km/h / 186mph approx. According to the SCA expert, with its power unit, the V6 turbocharged engine of a Formula 1 car can produce roughly 1050 horsepower. When this power is combined with the architecture and other characteristics of a Formula 1 car, you get a machine that can reach speeds around 400 km/h.

A Formula One car is an open-wheel, open-cockpit, single-seat racing car for the purpose of being used in Formula One

Can a normal person drive F1 car?

The answer is yes. As long as you're healthy and monitored, you can take the wheel of an F1 car.

Finally, there are Formula 1's VIP tickets, also known as the paddock club. Paddock club tickets cost around \$6,000 for three day access, again depending on the track. Two day access is around \$5,600 and Friday access is about \$1,000.


