**Dear Josephites,**

Welcome to St. Joseph's College. This college is managed by the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. The Jesuits is a religious Order founded by Saint Ignatius of Loyola in 1540.

The aims and objectives of the college, other than imparting the academic requirements of teaching and study, are specially catered towards a holistic training of the personality in order to make students into persons for others, for the society at large, and for the country. The educational system includes a pattern of training that will instill the basic values of tolerance, humanity, consistency, and the pursuit of excellence in every student.

St. Joseph's College, Hassan, is run by the Hassan Jesuit Educational Society (HJES) which also has a few other educational institutions at the school and college level under its care. The HJES aims to carry out the noble objectives of the Jesuit philosophy of education.

**Vision of the College:**

Compassion of the Creator, journeying with others towards integral human liberation.

**Mission of the College:**

Inspired by the voice of God, and partnering with others, we strive to provide holistic education and form human communities based on freedom, love, reconciliation, and service.

**Aims and Objectives of the College:**

In keeping with the ethos of the Society of Jesus, the guiding force behind this institution, and in tune with the spirit and needs of the present era, the College aims at the holistic formation of students, helping them to become men and women imbued with a spirit of excellence and an abiding concern for others. These are guided by three intertwined goals:

**i) Academic Excellence:**

The college has set high standards of education. Personal involvement in the study is ensured through assignments, seminars, personal reading, and use of the library facility. The objective is to make the student develop the art of critical thinking. Associations such as ALMA (Association for Literature, Music, and Art), CSA (Centre for Social Action), AICUF (All India Catholic Union Federation), NSS (National Service Scheme), Choir, Kannada Sangha, Hindi Parishad, Eco Club, Literary Club, Corporate Club, Adventure Club, etc. provide opportunities to students, to develop and display their talents and abilities.

**ii) Character Formation:**

The College considers the formation of character as an essential aspect of education. Character includes behavior, values, and attitudes to life. The stress is not only on hard work, perseverance, honesty, and sensitivity to others but also on universal love, which embraces all people cutting across language, religion, and caste barriers.

**iii) Social Concern:**

Concern for others is at the heart of education in the college. We expect all our students to place their knowledge at the service of society. The college provides students with plentiful opportunities for personal and social development. Our mission is to build up a group of men and women who would be agents of change towards a secular world of fraternity, equality, and justice.

**Campus Ethos:**

A healthy atmosphere exists on the campus. Sensitivity to each other, care and concern for one another, creative mindset, approachable nature, homely atmosphere, and healthy student-staff relationship.

**Co-Education:**

The purpose of bringing growing young men and women together during the post-school period is to facilitate an emotional growth while the intellect is trained in secular knowledge. Exclusive pairing within the premises or on campus, eve-teasing shall be considered as serious offenses.

**Mentorship:**

The role of mentors is to contribute to the holistic development of the students under their care. Mentoring entails to be supportive towards the student and to help a student in any specific way in which he or she may require guidance. Each class has a mentor, the role of the mentors is to be supportive towards the student and be a link between the student and the department, between the subject teachers and the students, between the parents and the students and between the students themselves. They contribute to the holistic development of the students under their care.

**Counselling and Spiritual Support:**

The college provides the students with counsellors to tackle emotional and academic problems. While the students are encouraged to visit the counsellors by voluntary appointment, the college may also refer students who may benefit from such referral.

Regular value inputs are given to all students in order to deliberate on and assimilate human, social and spiritual values. Besides, a multi-religious prayer room is provided for quiet relaxation and prayer.

**Parents and Guardians:**

Parents and Guardians are partners with the college in the task of total and integral education of their wards. It is in

keeping with this concept of 'partnership-in-education' that the Management invites the parents/guardians of the students in batches to discuss the performance of their children. The dates of the meetings are announced in the calendar and will also be intimated. Parents/guardians are requested to attend the meetings. It is also recommended that they meet the Class Mentors to ascertain the conduct and progress of their wards. The college welcomes suggestions from parents and well-wishers.

### **Sports and Games:**

The institution emphasizes the development of physical prowess along with intellectual growth in its endeavor to provide holistic education. Students are encouraged to participate in inter-class and inter-collegiate tournaments.

### **Staff- Student Rapport:**

Our lives are shaped very much by the people with whom we constantly interact. We have excellent staff in this college. Students can make good use of the experience and knowledge of the staff through constant personal contact both inside and outside the class room. In the world full of stress due to various distractions of life, counselling and guidance to be a relief to the stressful life. Students should approach the councilors and the trained staff available in the campus, in order to learn the art of handling stress.

### **Scholarships and Freeships:**

In keeping with the mission of the Institution, the college offers financial assistance to deserving students. The scholarships are given in two categories.

#### **Group A: Merit-cum-need based Scholarship.**

**Group B: Students who excel in Sports and Extra-curricular activities.**



**COLLEGE REGULATIONS:**

1. Every student must wear his/her college identity card at all times on the college campus. The ID should be shown to the staff or college officials on demand, especially during examinations, formal programs, in administrative office, and in the library.
2. The warning bell (First bell) for class is given five minutes before the commencement of classes. Students should be in their respective classrooms before the second bell. When a lecturer enters the class, the students must rise and remain standing until they are instructed to sit down.
3. There should be complete silence in the corridors during class hours. Students must not loiter in the corridors during class hours.
4. No student is allowed to leave the lecture hall without the lecturer's permission or until the classes are dismissed.
5. The lecturer may use his/her discretion to admit a student who is late by a maximum of five minutes for the first hour of the day. The Principal's permission is needed to admit a student who is late by more than five minutes.
6. Students are liable to disciplinary action (even dismissal) if found smoking on the campus, or in possession of or under the influence of tobacco products, forbidden drugs, or alcoholic beverages.
7. In keeping with the circular of the Department of Collegiate Education, Government of Karnataka, the use of mobile phones on the campus is prohibited. Students are informed not to use mobiles within the academic block. Once confiscated, mobiles will not be returned to the students. Possession of mobile phone



or similar electronic devices or resorting to unfair means during examination is considered a serious malpractice.

8. Ragging is a cognizable offence and those who indulge in it or encourage it will be handed over to the law as per G.O. Ed. 122 URC 96 dated 16.1.97. Students in distress may call the national Anti-ragging helpline at 1800-180-5522 (Toll-free) or email at [helpline@antiragging.in](mailto:helpline@antiragging.in)
9. Though the college is not responsible for the conduct of its students outside the premises, it will take note of any serious misconduct of students outside the campus.
10. Students are expected to dress neatly and have their hairstyles in conformity with norms of decency and propriety. Boys and Girls shall observe proper dress code in the college. No inappropriate dress, in the name of ethnic day or any other celebration, will be permitted in the classrooms and on the campus. Different attire, accouterment, and marking that represents domestic and personal in nature is prohibited.
11. Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions. Strict action will be taken on those who bring outsiders into the campus.
12. Eating and chewing gum, while the class is in progress is strictly prohibited.
13. The campus must be kept clean at all times. Littering, defacing the walls or desks, damaging college property etc. are offenses. Every class under the guidance of the class representative will be responsible for the cleanliness of the room allotted to it.



**LIBRARY RULES:**

1. The library will be open from 9 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on all working days and during vacations. On Saturdays, it will be open from 9a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
2. Strict silence should be maintained in and near the reading room.
3. Application for library books should be made in the prescribed form. The name of the book, the name of the author, and the call number of the book must be clearly stated when applying for books.
4. A student who fails to return the books within 10 days will be fined two rupees for each day beyond the due date excluding Sundays and Holidays.
5. An extension of the period may be obtained if the same book has not been applied for by another.
6. Books lost, damaged, or defaced must be paid for by the student. Loss of pages, mutilation, and other damage discovered on the return of books will be charged.
7. Loss of a book borrowed from the library must be intimated to the librarian in good time.
